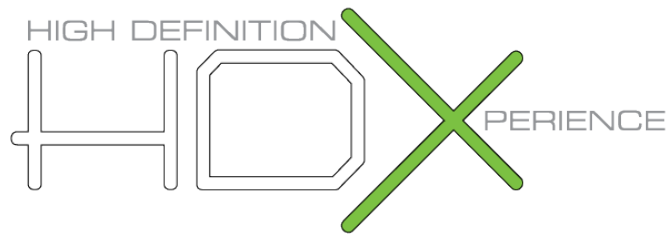


# HDX Google Android Operation Guide



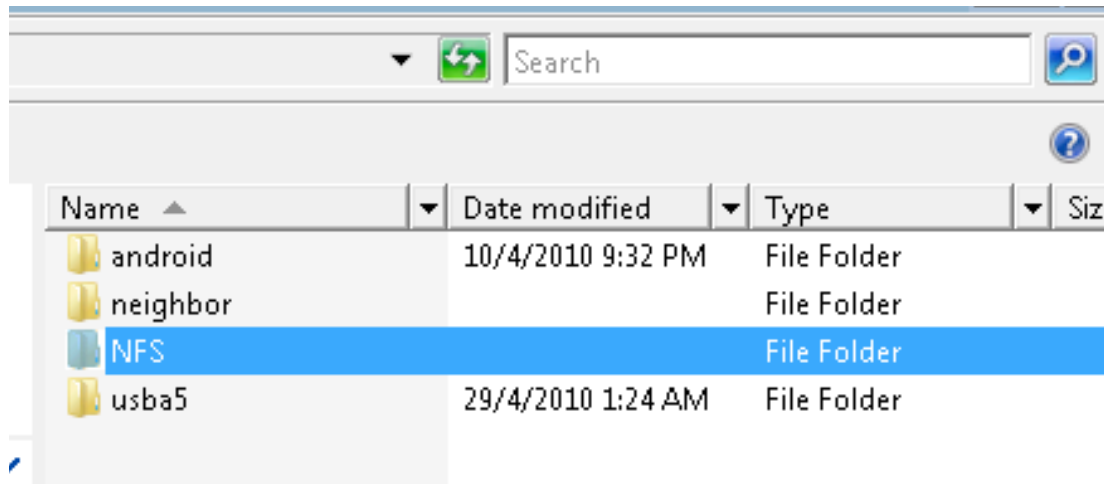
# How to navigate in Google android?

There are 2 options available, which we will explain below.

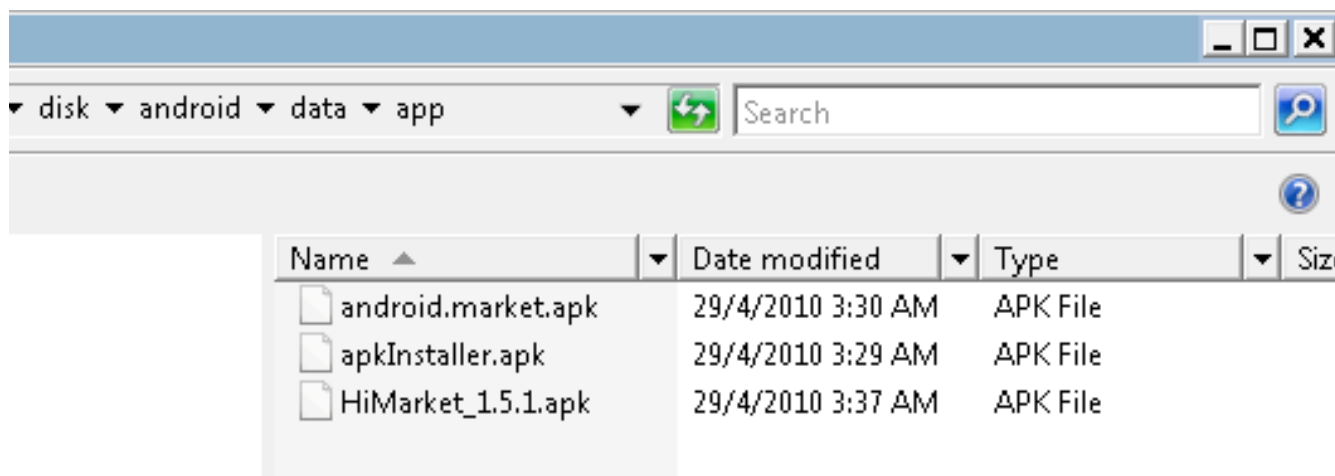
- **Via your remote control**
  - You can navigate around the android using the supplied remote control.
    - D-Pad - Move between icons, links and page up and down.
    - Info (i) - OPTIONS menu available within the apps.
    - Return - Quickly return to the previous page.
    - Play - Execute a command or enter.
  - To properly shut-down your android, please click on th REBOOT icon.
- **Via USB keyboard. (optional mini-b to type A USB converter needed)**
  - Support normal USB wired keyboard or 2.4Ghz wireless USB keyboard.
    - Arrow Key - Move between icons, links and page up and down.
    - F1 Key - OPTIONS menu available within the apps.
    - F2 key - Quickly return to the previous page.
    - Home key - Return to home screen

# How to install my android apps?

- Depending on how you have configure and install your android, the folder name varies. In this example, we named our android partition as Android as shown below.

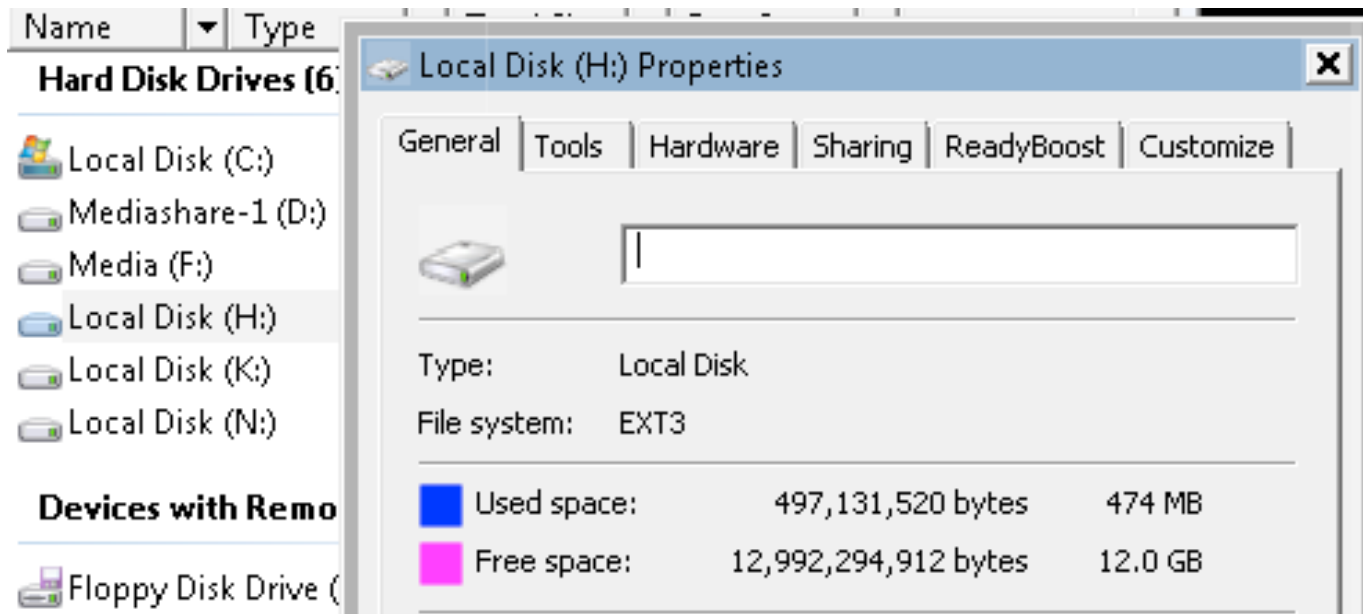


- Access the android folder, and navigate to data/apps (do not temper with the rest of the directory if you do not know what you are doing!). Copy apps to this directory. The installation is complete.



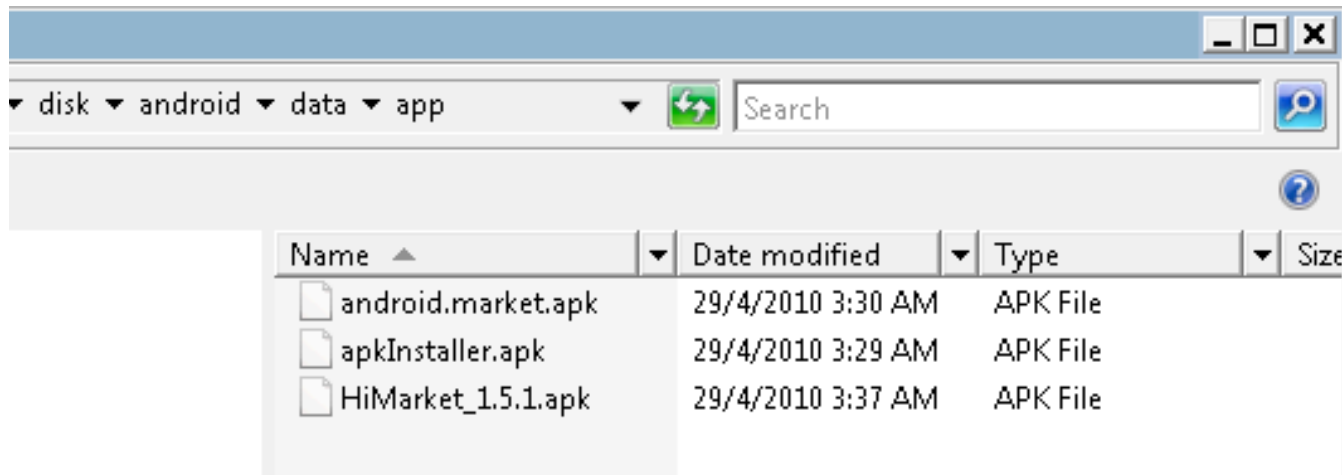
# How to install my android apps?

- Via USB
  - Before you mount your HDX Bone to your PC, please ensure that your PC has the ability to read/write a linux EXT3 partition. We recommend installing ext2fds which is a freeware.
  - After mounting the HDX Bone, you are able to access the android partition as shown below.



# How to install my android apps?

- Navigate to H: (check your drive letter, may differ) and you can see the android directory. Go-to data/apps and copy the apps to that folder.



- Installation is complete, just start up the Bone and boot to Android. The apps will be install automatically.

# FAQ

Q: I have copied an apk into correct directory, why does it not install?

A: Certain application requires the touchscreen component to be available for operation, hence will not install properly.

Q: I have successfully install the apps, however it does not open or crash my android.

A: As above

Q: Some application fonts are too small, I can't read it properly.

A: Since android is developed mainly for mobile phone correctly, some apps developer did not cater for larger format display hence the fonts used are limited to mobile display.

Q: Why Google market is not available?

A: Although android is a open-sorce OS, the market is a closed source developed program by Google which requires licenses to operation.
